What do you study? I study systems and interventions that improve outcomes for all students, particularly in improving behavioral, social, and emotional outcomes. The intervention work I engage in centers in schools and applies to classroom teachers and administrators (and sometimes bus drivers and school resource officers), as well as students and their caregivers.

We're actively recruiting for these CYDI studies:

Teens & Social Anxiety

We are studying how teens with social anxiety respond to social stimuli using a variety of eye tracking tasks, computerized task, and questionnaires and interviews.

At least one parent must participate in the study with their child. Parents will receive a payment of \$35 after completion of the study.

Criteria for inclusion:

- Ages 12-16 years old
- Concerns about social relationships (social anxiety)
- Free of learning disorders

SENSE Theatre

We are studying the effects of two group interventions developed for youth with ASD. Participants will be randomly assigned to 1 of 2 treatments:

- An intervention targeting social skills using musical theatre techniques
- An education program teaching psychological, social, and sexual development

Criteria for inclusion:

- Ages 10-16 years old
- Suspected or confirmed ASD diagnosis

EASE Intervention

We are studying the effects of an intervention developed to help individuals with ASD manage difficult emotions. Participants will be randomly assigned to either:

- A mindfulness-based intervention
- A supportive therapy intervention

Criteria for inclusion:

- Ages 12-21 years old
- Suspected or confirmed ASD diagnosis
- Difficulty managing emotions
